## **ORTHODOX ACTIVITIES**

The Church of Evangelismos has been conducting Divine Liturgies in English on Saturday mornings for the past 2 years. This will again continue for 2008. The dates being:

30 August 13 September 27 September 11 October 25 October 15 November 29 November 13 December

The Liturgy commences at 8.45am and concludes at 10am.

The Greek Orthodox Church of Evangelismos has established a Bookshop which is housed in the building next to the Church (within the church grounds) which was opened in December 2006 with an Agiasmos Service by Fr Emmanuel Stamatiou.

The bookstore exists for the purpose of being a resource for Orthodox Christianity and for anyone seeking information and truth about the true and original Christian Church in all of her richness.

The bookstore staff is constantly searching avenues to obtain additional resources for the purpose of communicating our faith to all who come. The bookstore is here to educate, serve and augment the Orthodox Christian faith.

There are many types of books available for sale such as books on the lives of the saints, theological texts, guides to religious practise, information booklets, prayer books, liturgical texts, texts on spiritual guidance by the Holy Fathers, children's religious story and poetry books.

Besides reading material, the bookstore supplies the faithful with religious items for the home such as icons, kundillia, fragrant incense, incense burners (thymiatyria), and religious cards.

Many items are suitable for name-days, birthdays and baptisms.

The hours of operation are after Liturgy on Sunday. Weekdays, 4-6pm and after English Liturgies on Saturdays or ring Catherine Papanastasiou on 0434 332 032 outside of the above hours for any purchases.

The Inter-Parish Council of WA has commenced two programmes within our Perth community.

- 1) The commencement of Byzantine chanting classes for both men and women. The classes take place each Tuesday evening between 6 and 7pm in the hall of the Church of Evangelismos. These lessons are bilingual and the aim is for students to be able to read Byzantine music within six months.
- 2) The commencement of Byzantine Iconography classes for both genders above the age of 16. These classes are held at two venues: males at the Monastery of St John of the Mountain and the female classes are at the Hellenic Community of WA lesser hall. The classes are held on alternate Saturdays. These classes are conducted by Peter Kakulas who has a Diploma in Byzantine Iconography.

<u>www.kastellorizo.com.au</u> - Terrific site of the Kastellorizian Association of Victoria. Many items of interest including their newsletter online.

<u>www.kastellorizo.org</u> - Gives links to many Castellorizian websites – has not been updated for some time but includes links to great photographic sites portraying Castellorizo.

<u>www.castellorizo.org</u> – Genealogy site with over 9,300 names on the website containing various Family Trees. Initially stated out as a private website for the family history of Allan Cresswell, expanded to include WA Castellorizian families and recently is now including all families of Castellorizian descent. Over 500 photos on the site.

www.australianfriendskastellorizo.org - The Australian Friends of Kastellorizo was established to help create a positive future for Kastellorizo recognising our proud heritage and giving something back to the island of our forefathers.





## CAZZIE TRIBUTE

## ARTHUR MICHAEL ATHANS

Arthur Michael Athans (Athanasios Athanassiou) was born at Castellorizo on June 30<sup>th</sup> 1931. When aged 20 years, he migrated to Perth Western Australia aboard the Orion and arrived at Fremantle on March 15<sup>th</sup> 1950. The following year he sponsored his widowed mother and unmarried sister to join him in Perth.

In 1953 Arthur was a member of the Athena Progressive Association and volunteered his time and services in assisting the newly arrived Greek migrant youth with a range of cultural and sporting activities. During a ten year period he progressed from a committee member to a range of official positions until he became President. During these years he also worked tirelessly with others to establish the first Greek-Australian water polo team in the State.

Arthur served on the committee of the Hellenic Community of WA for various periods between 1959 and 2000. He also served as a volunteer with the Australian Hellenic Educational Progressive Association from 1968 to 1971. Then from 1992 to 1994 joined the committee of the Greek Australian Professionals and Businessmen's Association and served as assistant Treasurer.

Arthur became involved and volunteered his time and services to produce and present the bi-lingual radio programme, "The Voice of Athena" for many years. This programme included Arthur staying up late at night and documenting the BBC's Greek News, then conveying it to his listeners in Greek the next day. In September 2005 the Floreat Athena Soccer Club recognised his efforts in this field by presenting him with the President's Commemorative Plaque. His first radio programme was known as the "Campana Parade" and was broadcast from 1963 to 1969. In the 1980s and 1990s he returned to radio offering his time and expertise to assist the HCWA's radio programmes and for most of the 1990s was both a dedicated announcer and convenor.

In 1965 Arthur opened the Pan Hellenic Emporium in James Street Northbridge which was an ethnic newsagency and record store. This shop was the first of its kind in Perth. Here he imported Greek newspapers, music, magazines and other European items that New Australians could not access elsewhere. This store became an ethnic landmark for many migrants and Arthur was always available to provide guidance and assistance to help new arrivals settle in Australia. Arthur and his wife, Eva, ran the store until 1993.

Arthur has been associated with the Castellorizian Association of Western Australia for over 50 years. From a fund raiser, to committee member, Vice President and Treasurer, has seen Arthur fully committed to an association which has now bestowed Life Membership to him in recognition of his services.

In more recent times Arthur has volunteered to visit and chat with the residents of the Hellenic Aged Care Facility where he is a most welcomed visitor and friend to the elderly who reside there.

On Australia Day 2008 Arthur received the Order of Australia Medal (OAM) which is the highest level of recognition by the Australian nation, for his outstanding achievement, contribution and community service. His life long contributions and efforts not only had a marked effect on the social, psychological and physical wellbeing of the State's Greek population, but has impacted on the broader community. Well done Arthur!

The summary in the Australia Day Honours List states: Arthur Athans, Dianella, WA, for service to the Greek Community of Western Australia through a range of cultural, charitable and media organisations.
